

Member Benefit Programs That Support ISVMA

ISVMA recently launched a program with TransFirst Health Services to provide quality merchant services for ISVMA members and help them save on the cost of processing credit cards. After reviewing several options, it was determined that TransFirst Health was the most competitive, consultative, and cooperative processor available. They have an excellent track record working with several other state veterinary medical associations.

In those other states, member veterinary practices are saving money AND the program is providing substantial support to the associations. TransFirst pays a 1% royalty to the state association for every dollar that is charged through the program. In other words, the state association gets a \$1000 royalty for every \$1 million processed by TransFirst. One of the state veterinary medical associations anticipates an annual royalty payment of \$70,000 this year – and the program has only been in place two years!

So far, only 13 ISVMA member clinics/hospitals have signed up for the program and their total anticipated credit transactions are approximately \$1.5 million. Those practices are enjoying the savings through the program and supporting ISVMA.

ISVMA will likely introduce other member benefit programs to assist member practices AND support ISVMA. Programs such as these help reduce reliance on member dues increases and provide resources to augment member services.
