On March 3, 2008 the ISVMA moved into its new headquarters at 1121 Chatham Road in Springfield. The new building is in an optimal location to serve our membership. About the Photo

The [Skylark](#) (*Alauda arvensis*) is a small passerine bird species which breeds across most of Europe and Asia and in the mountains of north Africa. It is mainly resident in the west of its range, but eastern populations are more migratory, moving further south in winter. Even in the milder west of its range, many birds move to lowlands and the coast in winter. Asian birds appear as vagrants in Alaska; and the species has also been introduced in Hawaii and its North American range is limited to Vancouver Island, British Columbia.

It is a bird of open farmland and heath. It has a remarkable courtship ritual for which is known throughout its range. The song of the male is delivered in hovering flight from heights of 150 to 350 feet, when the singing bird may appear as just a dot in the sky from the ground. The song generally lasts 2 to 3 minutes, but it tends to last longer later in the season. The male has broader wings than the female. This adaptation for more efficient hovering flight may have evolved because of female Skylarks' preference for males that sing and hover for longer periods and so demonstrate that they are likely to have good overall fitness.

Like most other larks, the Skylark is a rather dull-looking species on the ground, being mainly brown above and paler below. It has a short blunt crest on the head, which can be raised and lowered. In flight it shows a short tail and short broad wings. The tail and the rear edge of the wings are edged with white, which are visible when the bird is flying away, but not if it is heading towards the observer. The Skylark has sturdy legs and spends much time on the ground foraging for seeds, supplemented with insects in the breeding season.
