Illinois Diseased Animals Act

The "Illinois Diseased Animals Act" was passed, and the Regulations Relating to Diseased Animals were filed, in 1972 (510 ILCS 50/1). This statute created the laws pertaining to cases or alleged cases of contamination or contagious and infectious diseases among animals within the State.

(510 ILCS 50/22) (from Ch. 8, par. 189)

Sec. 22. Any veterinarian having information of the existence of any contamination or reportable disease among animals in this State, who fails to promptly report such knowledge to the Department, shall be guilty of a business offense and shall be fined in any sum not exceeding \$1,000 for each offense.

Section 85.10 of the Rules and Regulations Pertaining to carrying out the Illinois Diseased Animals Act provides a list of those diseases that are required to be reported immediately to the Illinois Department of Agriculture. It can be found online at www.agr.state.il.us/Laws/index.html under TITLE 8: AGRICULTURE AND ANIMALS , CHAPTER I: DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE , SUBCHAPTER b: ANIMALS AND ANIMAL PRODUCTS (EXCEPT MEAT AND POULTRY INSPECTION ACT REGULATIONS) , PART 85 DISEASED ANIMALS.

This section also states that any veterinarian failing to report a suspect case of any of the listed diseases immediately after discovery, or who is responsible for the spread of the disease, shall be subject to penalty as provided by law.
