University of Wisconsin-Madison

Dr. Barnes Heller obtained her veterinary degree from Michigan State University in 2000. Following graduation she completed a rotating internship at the University of Illinois and a residency in neurology/neurosurgery at the University of Florida.

Dr. Barnes Heller obtained board certification from the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine in 2005. She was the staff neurologist in a private referral hospital outside Chicago Illinois until December 2010, after which point she joined the University of Wisconsin-Madison School of Veterinary Medicine in neurology and neurosurgery. Dr. Barnes Heller's main area of research is seizure detection and management. She has pioneered the development of novel anti-convulsant drug administration for cats and small dogs including transdermal applications. Other areas of interest include inflammatory brain disease and neurosurgery.

Demystifying Canine Vestibular Disease

During this session we will review the anatomy and normal function of the vestibular system, and apply this knowledge to a case based discussion of differential diagnosis, diagnostic testing and treatment options for canine vestibular disease.

Managing Chronic Canine Seizures

What does good seizure control mean? Often, clients' goals do not align with our goals for dogs with chronic seizures. With the increased availability of novel anti-seizure medications, choosing the appropriate medication can be overwhelming. This session will focus on appropriate goal setting by clients and veterinarians, and novel and "standard" anti-seizure drug treatment options. Additionally we will discuss when, and how to appropriately monitor therapeutic serum levels and trouble shooting for difficult cases. This session will be case based to allow easy translation to clinical practice.

Neuromuscular Disease in Dogs and Cats

Neuromuscular disease is a problem affecting the peripheral nerves, neuromuscular junction, and/or muscles. Diseases such as botulism, tick paralysis and polyradiculoneuropathy can affect the neuromuscular system and result in a unique constellation of clinical signs. Come prepared to review the neuromuscular system, and its distinctive manifestations of disease.

When Back Pain Isn't a Surgical Disease

Fibrocartilagenous emboli, discospondylitis, and meningomyelitis can present with identical history and examination findings to a dog with a disc herniation and yet surgery is not the treatment of choice for these other diseases. Come prepared to discuss these different diseases and learn tricks to differentiating them from disc hernations, as well as cutting edge medical management for each disease. This casebased format is designed to encourage discussion and dialog about these 'great pretenders' of the back.
